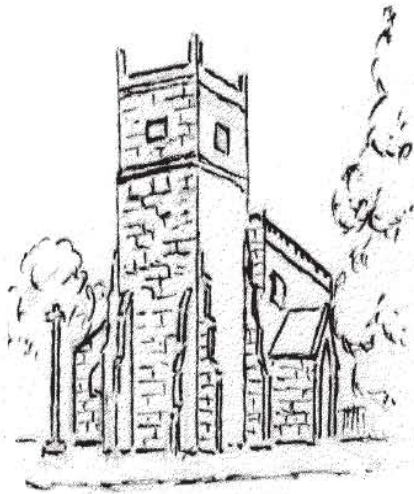
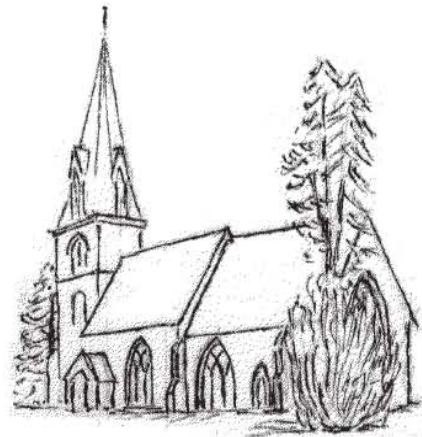

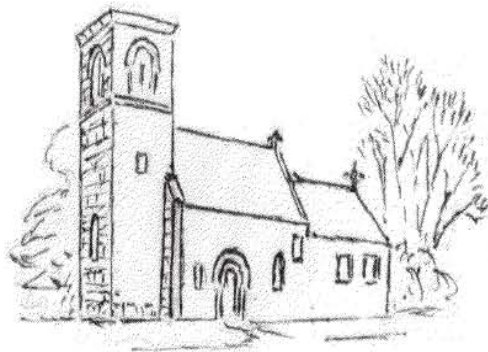

By the time you receive this month's magazine the Christian church will fast be approaching Holy Week--those few days each year when we are reminded of Jesus' journey into Jerusalem for which he had been preparing for the three or so years of his ministry. It all began on Palm Sunday, a day of celebration, as the crowds, flocking in from the countryside, for the religious festival of Passover, gathered with palm branches to hail Jesus, seated on a donkey, with shouts of "Hosanna to the Son of David."

Many perhaps believed they were hailing a new leader who might free them from the oppressive rule of the Romans.

Many others however, saw this as a chance to do away with a man who seemed to challenge their authority and upset their long-held beliefs which were governed by adherence to rules and regulations.

On the Thursday, Maundy Thursday as we call it, when our Queen visits a cathedral to give away Maundy money, we find Jesus sharing a final supper with his close followers before going out to his arrest, trials and eventual crucifixion on Good Friday.

In many towns, including Ashbourne, there will be a 'Walk of Witness' through the town as local Christians remember the walk Jesus took through Jerusalem to Calvary where, 'He died that we might be forgiven' as the children's hymn puts it.

Easter Sunday brings the good news that Jesus rose again triumphing over death. The Christian church will proclaim those famous words: "Christ is risen, He is risen indeed. Allelulia!" And in the presence and power of His Spirit we shall be reminded that He is alive for evermore.

As usual, Services in the Benefice during Holy Week and on into April provide everyone with the chance to attend church and to worship God at this important time in the Christian calendar.

With the Interregnum now in full swing, may I ask you to support your local church, to make it a priority in the coming weeks, to encourage one another and be reminded of God's continuing love for each of us.

However, we need your prayers to root this project in Christ and make sure that God's hand guides us to move in the right direction for a healthy project which will enhance and even change the lives of many young Ashbournians.

We are holding a prayer café at **St Oswald's Church on Saturday April 25<sup>th</sup> from 12 – 5pm** to support our young people's issues across the area, and in particular the planned youth centre. ## UPDATE FROM YOUR LOCAL OFFICER

April, 2009

We've had a quieter time over the past few weeks. At around 0520 hrs on the 3<sup>rd</sup> March 2009, at Parwich, a local resident was disturbed by clattering and banging outside. He saw a vehicle drive away from the area, which was described as a small reddish van. The van left as the house lights were switched on. Details were passed to us, and it has resulted in some good intelligence with liaison with other Police Forces. No offences were committed around the area that night but it was an excellent call to us.

At Kniveton, during the 5<sup>th</sup> March 2009, a property at Kniveton was visited by two suspicious men claiming to be there to check on the Burglar alarm. The occupier was not present and the person who dealt with them refused them entry. If you are ever in doubt with unexpected callers always make them stand on the doorstep, until you have checked out their identification with their company, or with us. Each month I do include a number at the bottom of the page for Severn Trent Water. One of the most favoured ways of gaining entry by distraction is to claim to be from the Water Board. If in doubt, please use the number below.

On 12<sup>th</sup> March 2009 we had the Tissington Safer Neighbourhood Team Community Forum, this time held at Kniveton Village Hall. A small group of people attended and we discussed a number of issues, including road safety issues. The meeting heard that Operation Blodwen, which related to overgrown verges obstructing junctions, along with some other road safety concerns was being closed. Members of the public are encouraged to use the Call Derbyshire number 08456 058 058 to report verges that restrict views, potholes, icy roads, or any other highways issues. This number is the County Council call centre. They will take details and get someone to look at the issue. The number can also be used for stray dogs, trading standards issues, any issue that the County Council may deal with. Currently running on our area is Operation Coriander. This relates to Madge Hill, Kniveton. Please report any 4 x 4s, off road motor bikes that are using the lane to us. Please try and do so at the time, and give the direction of travel. Also now running is Operation Oilseed. This relates to

pupils unruly behaviour on some school buses. Queen Elizabeths Grammar School has some concerns over pupils behaviour on the school buses, in particular on the journey home. They dealt with issues themselves by speaking to pupils and parents and, if need be, will remove bus passes. They have asked us to assist and we will be doing random 'ride a longs' on the school buses that are causing concern. Some of these are on our area. The next meeting is going to be held on Thursday 25<sup>th</sup> June 2009, at Thorpe Village Hall, at 1930 hours.

### **Organ Appeal**

As you may be aware from your visits to St Michael's, the existing electric organ, donated by the Bunting family in 1975 in memory of William John

Bunting, has now reached the end of its useful working life. Unfortunately the instrument is beginning to fail, with some notes and stops no longer functioning. We were advised at its last service that it is no longer repairable and will therefore have to be replaced. It would be impossible to imagine the weekly worship at this beautiful little church, not to mention the weddings, baptisms and funeral services, continuing without the music provided by a suitable replacement instrument. After much research we have found such an instrument in the Viscount Vivace 30/30. This is an electronic organ, similar in size and appearance to the one it will replace, but such have been the technical advances in recent years that it will sound like a traditional church pipe organ, only for approximately a tenth of the cost. It will require virtually no maintenance over a life expectancy of another thirty years. We have negotiated a price of £4150 as long as we can complete purchase in the next six months. We very much hope you will be able to support our appeal and thereby help to maintain the key role played by music in the church's life. **If you can be of any help, please contact the church wardens.**

## **Grand opening of the “Chill Out” Area in Tissington**

On **April 2<sup>nd</sup> at 7.15pm** Tissington Youth Club will celebrate the opening of a new Chill Out area with a Bar-B-Q. The local press will be invited to report on the project for us and any one who has helped us complete this project is welcome to join us.



Tissington Youth Club has been fortunate enough to receive a grant from the May Heathcote Trust and the Derbyshire Community Foundation Trust.

In the last few months there has been work done to develop a “Chill Out” and hard surface play area next to the existing playing field. The area of land was cleared of rubble and weeds and resurfaced. The surrounding wall has been repaired and 25 laurel trees planted to make a natural screen.

A couple of years ago two village girls Kelly Greatorex and Rebecca Dorland raised the money to purchase a bench with an arbour which is now in the top corner of this area.
