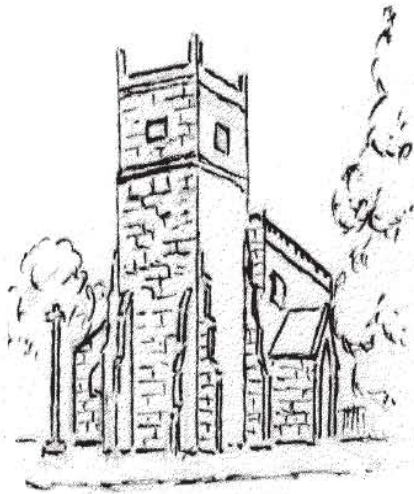
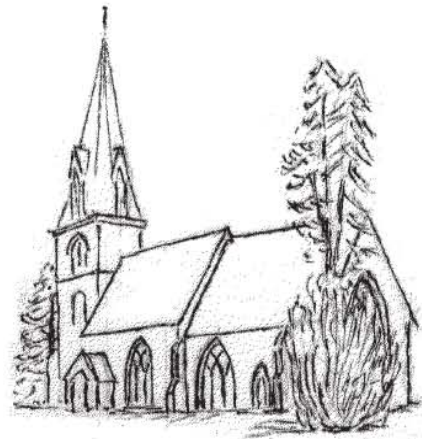

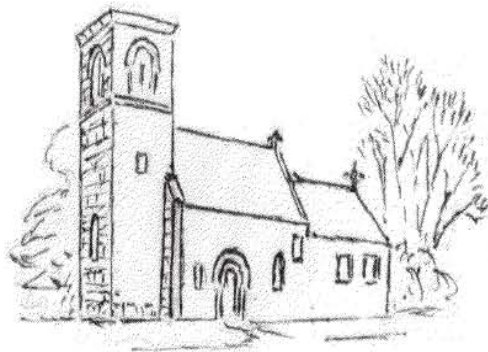

Have faith

As I write Palm Sunday has moved to Easter Day and beyond. It has been a roller coaster of days. **Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord,** as Jesus enters Jerusalem, later **Crucify! Crucify! Crucify!** And then **Alleluia Christ is risen. He is risen indeed. Alleluia.**

The drama of Palm Sunday involves Christians in a journey they have to take, uncomfortable through it may be. Christians have to arrive at the cross in order to get beyond it. Christians have to see themselves among the bystanders in order to understand their participation with them. Christians have to see how God transforms the cross from an instrument of death into a symbol of eternal life. I was blessed when I experienced this last week in Oberammergau.

The Passion Play presented by the residents in Oberammergau every ten years shows what happened in Jerusalem from Palm Sunday through to the Resurrection of our Lord, Jesus Christ. I went in the year 2000 with a very open mind. As the play progressed I began to feel the fear, the tension, the love, and the promise. During the trial of Jesus I wanted to shout “stop he is innocent” I didn’t like all on that day I said nothing. Then the crucifixion, the clang of the hammer as the nails are driven, through flesh, in to the wooden cross. You begin to ask yourself why, what is it all about? Some time after you hear the words **“Father forgive them for they know not what they do”** and it is over or is it.

When I was leaving, somewhat slowly an American shouts “are you crippled move I want to get a meal and a drink” So back to reality for the American it was only a play. However for me it was an experience and I thank God for the blessing. When the American spoke I thought of those words Jesus said **“Father forgive them for they know not what they do”**

Easter Day is past Jesus is with us and we’re reading about Thomas, who couldn’t believe Jesus had been raised from the dead.

The story recorded in John’s Gospel (John 20: 19-31) seems so simple. Thomas wasn’t there when Jesus appeared to the apostles the first time – and when he heard about that, he simply found it hard to fathom. “I won’t believe until I see it for myself,” he says. However Jesus calls his bluff.

The following week, the apostles, including Thomas, were in a room when Jesus appeared among them. Jesus offered Thomas the chance to touch his hand and his side, but Thomas doesn’t seem to need to do that. Instead he offers Jesus his profession of faith: **“My Lord and my God.”**

Jesus doesn't appear to Thomas alone nor does he appear to Thomas in the group to embarrass him. Jesus appears to the group because it is within the group that they can continue to learn about him, supporting each other, and being effective witnesses to the life of faith Jesus offers them and us.

In another sense, Jesus is strengthening us all. We, too, are a gathered community – getting together at the beginning of the week in very much the same way as the apostles did. They gathered to share their real life experience of knowing Jesus and working with him. We gathered together through our Lent lunches let us continue by meeting together in Gods house at the beginning of each week.

UPDATE FROM YOUR LOCAL OFFICER

May, 2009

Over the past month we have had more incidents than in recent months, with some thefts, damage, and suspicious prowlers. The A515 has also seen a few Road Traffic Collisions.

Overnight on Saturday 14th March 2009, damage was caused to some fencing at a farm between Tissington Village and the Ford. The damage appeared to be a deliberate act rather than accident damage. Damage, in the form of graffiti, occurred between 24th and 30th March 2009 in Fenny Bentley. The bus shelter seat, speed limit signs and bridge were sprayed with grey and black painted 'tags'. Thorpe has also been the location for further damage, with a Vauxhall Cavalier car being scratched whilst parked on Church Lane, sometime between 11th and 13th April 2009. If anyone has seen anyone acting suspiciously in these areas, around these times please let me know.

On 10th April 2009 a prowler was heard at the rear of a house in Thorpe, and ran off towards Digmire Lane. A prowler was also heard in the Kniveton area, on the 16th April 2009. Police attended both incidents, areas were checked but no one traced.

A New Holland tractor was stolen from a farm at Pikehall, sometime between 28th and 30th March 2009. Callow Top campsite has suffered a little with push bikes being stolen on 2 separate occasions, 11th and then the 18th April 2009. They also had some damage caused by a car driving round the site. A number of people were arrested and are now on bail whilst enquiries are completed.

Many people have commented on problems with the Temporary Traffic lights along the B5035. If they do not seem to be working correctly please let us know so we can call out the contractors. Some of the problems have been because they have had diesel stolen from them. If anyone is seen acting suspiciously near to the lights, or if any vehicles are parked nearby, please let us know so we can check them out.

I have managed to get to some Parish Council meetings, but have had to also send apologies to some. If there are issues you want to raise with me, please contact me. If issues are raised at the Parish Council meetings, and the Clerks feel I should know, they will pass details onto me.

Summary of Minutes of Tissington and Lea Hall Annual Parish Meeting Held on Monday 6th April 2009 at 7.30 p.m. in Tissington Village Hall

Welcome and election of officers

The outgoing chairman welcomed everyone to the meeting.

Chris Carr and Michael Stubbs were nominated and seconded and duly elected for the position of chairman and vice-chairman respectively. Chris Carr thereupon took the Chair.

Minutes of the last meeting held on 14th April 2008 were read and signed as a correct record.

Accounts for the financial year 2008/2009

Copies of the draft accounts had been circulated. After questions had been raised and answered it was resolved to approve the accounts.

Matters raised from the floor:

Play Area

Favourable comments were made on the new 'chill out area' created by the Youth Club for the children and a request was made for the playing area to be enlarged. The Councillors agreed to pursue this with The Estate.

Well Dressing one-way system

The stopping of traffic from turning left off Rakes Lane to go up Sawpit Hill was resulting in vehicles using the narrow Chapel Lane to gain access to Flats Lane. This was dangerous for the number of pedestrians using Chapel Lane. George Maxwell to report the problem to the Well Dressing stewards.

Parking Issues near Village Hall

Problems with parking on the service roads in front of the village hall and on the corners by Church House and The Vicarage together with double parking especially at school times was giving cause for concern. The service roads should allow access for emergency vehicles and access to properties in this area. Requests to be made to The Kinder Garden and Pre School Group for care and consideration when parking.

The Gennel Footpath

The Councillors were informed this was a disgrace. The tarmac was in need of repair. During the bad weather the icy and snow made the path dangerous and now the weeds were growing it needed cleaning up before Well Dressings.

Planning Application

This becomes due on 1st June 2009 with Zurich Insurance plc the renewal premium being £188.08. The Council approved the payment of this premium.

Highway Maintenance

Damage to the sign near the cattle grids at the top of the Ford hill to be reported to DCC.

Village of the Year competition

After consultation with residents Sir Richard proposed the entry of this competition and this was agreed upon. The entry fee would be £15.00 and Sir Richard would complete the entry forms.

We all carry our mobile phones with names and numbers stored in its memory. If we were to be involved in an accident or were taken ill, the people attending us would have our mobile phone but wouldn't know who to call. Yes, there are hundreds of numbers stored but which one is the contact person in case of an emergency? Hence this 'ICE' (In Case of Emergency) Campaign.

The concept of 'ICE' is catching on quickly. It is a method of contact during emergency situations. As mobile phones are carried by the majority of the population, all you need to do is store the number of a contact person or persons who should be contacted during emergency under the name 'ICE' (In Case Of Emergency). The idea was thought up by a paramedic who found that when he went to the scenes of accidents there were always mobile phones with patients but they didn't know which number to call.

He therefore thought that it would be a good idea if there was a nationally recognised name for this purpose.

In an emergency situation, Emergency Service personnel and hospital Staff would be able to quickly contact the right person by simply dialling the number you have stored as 'ICE'.

Please forward this. It won't take too many 'forwards' before everybody will know about this. It really could save your life, or put a loved one's mind at rest.

For more than one contact name simply enter ICE1, ICE2 and ICE3 etc.
